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What is ALD?

The Accountancy Licensure Database (ALD) is a system that allows states to upload licensing and discipline information to a secure website where it can be shared with other boards of accountancy.

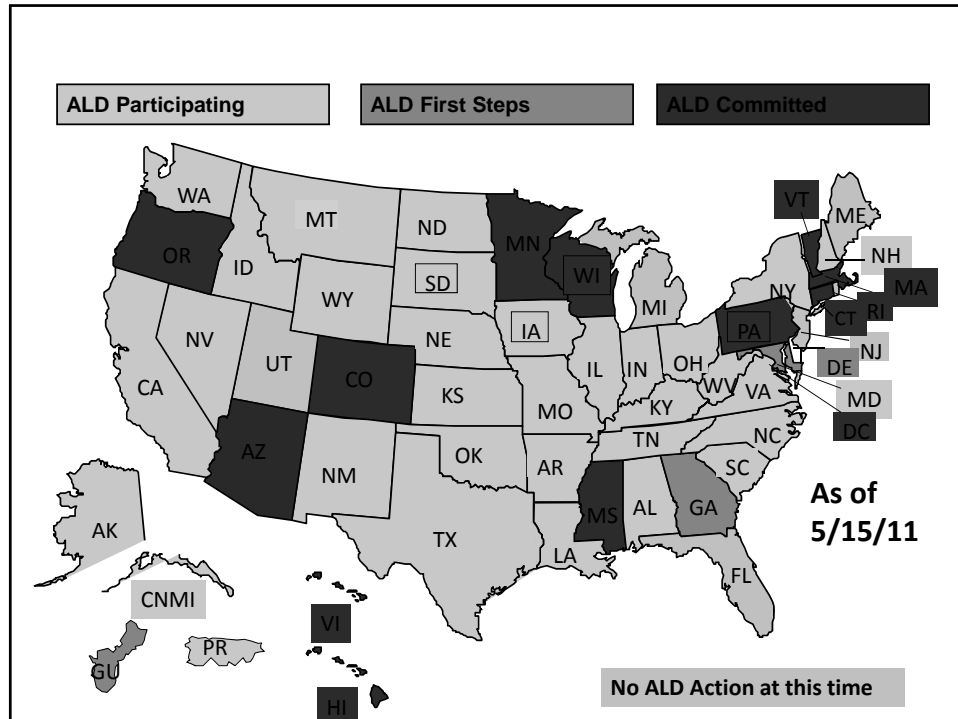


Why ALD?

- ALD allows state board staff to verify the licensing status of CPAs with minimal effort
- ALD can contain disciplinary action taken by state boards and that information is available to all boards
- ALD is secure and is only accessible by state board staff members

Why ALD?

- In the age of Mobility, ALD is the right tool for locating information about CPAs who take advantage of mobility and practice in jurisdictions without obtaining a reciprocal license



How to: ALD

- Participation in the ALD requires only that a state board send licensing and disciplinary information to NASBA in a secure format
- Standard data formats are published
